Good Morning Classmates!

At our 45<sup>th</sup> reunion, many of us toured the old Whitworth building. We were amazed by what has been done in the first phase of this project. There is much left to do as the remaining floors are transformed into great spaces to serve the people of Moscow and the surrounding area. If you missed that part of the reunion, I encourage you to take a tour when you're in town.

The development company (**Heart of the Arts, Inc. (HAI)**) was founded in 2003 to develop and fund artistic and cultural programs, using the 1912 Center (the old Whitworth School) as the centerpiece of that development. Heart of the Arts, Inc. is the non-profit company selected by the City of Moscow to run, maintain and grow the 1912 Center.

To manage the cost of rehabilitating this great old landmark, HIA is looking for people or groups willing to sponsoring a window. The price per window is \$1912, like the building's new name.

A few of us talked it over and we hope it would be possible for the Class of 1964 to sponsor at least one window. So far, four of our classmates, (including me), have committed \$100 each to get the ball rolling. I realize that everyone may not be able to offer that much but hope many of the class will be able to contribute at some level.

We have set a target date of September 1<sup>st</sup> (this year) as our goal for putting together a commitment. If the time frame is too short, we could shoot for December 31<sup>st</sup>. Since Heart of the Arts has a "501(c)3 / non-profit" tax status, our contributions will be deductible at Tax time.

Our own Jack Porter, a long time Whitworth advocate, has volunteered to act as a focal point for collecting our funds.
